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CALLED TO LOOK AHEAD

W elcome to our summer edition of the Messenger. I want to congratulate the 2024 Graduates and pray for success in their respective endeavours.

In May we gathered in PEI for the annual KT Norris Lectures – what a wonderful time of fellowship and teaching with Matt Dabbs. Our attendance at the Lectures this year indicated that this topic and Matt's speaking resonated with many people. Thank you to all who attended and who donated to make this event possible.

Maritime Christian College recently announced the launch of a new Certificate program called Disciple Maker's Path in response to feedback from MCC supporters, students, and church leaders. MCC developed this entry-level Certificate to help followers of Jesus understand the what, the how, and the why of sharing the truth of the Gospel of Jesus with others in their lives. This Certificate is a practical "tool kit" of disciple making essentials.

In December, the first graduates of our Master of Arts in Disciple Making & Ministry Leadership program will have completed their capstone projects. We are excited by the impact these first graduates will have on their current and future ministries. Recruitment for a new cohort of MA students is underway and two MA courses will be offered in September.

I want to direct your attention to a passage of Scripture that often doesn't get the attention it deserves as a model for the 21st century ministry planning. Acts 13:1-4 states:

¹Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul. ²While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." ³So after they had fasted and

prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off. ⁴The two of them, sent on their way by the Holy Spirit, went down to Seleucia and sailed from there to Cyprus. (NIV)

The Holy Spirit called Barnabas and Paul (Saul) to leave Antioch, initiating Paul's first missionary journey. It was the first of four missionary journeys recorded in Acts, and these journeys took Paul far from his home territory – eventually all the way to Rome. They were the catalyst to spreading the Gospel in an unprecedented burst of disciple making. I suspect Paul didn't have a clue about the vast distances the Lord would be sending him when he started out on this first journey.

But take note: the Holy Spirit *called* them and they were *sent* on their way by the Spirit. Paul and Barnabas were faithful and obedient to the calling they received from the Lord, even when they couldn't clearly see the road ahead and the incredible journeys that lay ahead of them (especially for Paul).

The Board and staff are looking ahead to discern the direction of the Holy Spirit for the next season. The Spirit seems to be bringing new opportunities for disciple making to our door. We are praying about these opportunities for expanding MCC's higher education programs into new areas with students where we have never effectively engaged. Like Barnabas and Paul in Antioch, we are trying to go where the Spirit is leading us. I look forward to sharing more about these new opportunities as we get more clarity around them in coming months.



ANNUAL Enrollment and Financial Reports

Academic Program Highlights from 2023-2024

- 45 students enrolled in online classes: 35 in undergrad programs and 10 in the master's program. Geographic location: Canada-37 (AB-1, MB-1, NB-10, NS-6 ON-11, PE-7, QC-1), Ethiopia-1, Nigeria-2, and USA-5 (KY-1, OK-1, TX-3)
- Continual evaluation of courses and programs to raise the bar on the quality of course development and instruction
- Logos Inclusive Access trial a Bible study program for ministers or students to prepare lessons or write sermons online efficiently
- Developing a new introductory certificate called "The Disciple Maker's Path" to be launched September 2024
- Exploring resourcing church leaders in Ontario
- Updating policies and procedures to reflect the new online environment



2023 Operating Revenue




Fiscal Highlights from 2023

- The 503 University Avenue property was sold for a net of \$2.1 million which was transferred to MCC's investment accounts to replenish them from the significant drawdown that has been going on for several years (not shown in Operating Revenue).
- The MCC office relocated to rented space inside Sherwood Christian Church in Charlottetown for \$1,000/month. Staff work from the office one day/ week and from home the rest of the week.
- 2023 Operating Revenue and Expenses include dorm room income and expenses for January-April, until the sale of the property, not a full year
- Tuition income increased by 123% with a full year of the new Masters Program.
- Donations from individuals decreased by -32% which caused a higher draw on investments
- Course developers and professors increased by 82% due to an increased number of online courses



"My favorite thing about online learning is the flexibility of time it offers. I can work on my lessons any time of the day, read and write and engage in class discussions, a perfect environment for me.



Why Give to MCC?

The average Canadian has set aside organized religion with its baggage for an internal authority which feels right.¹

- Developing positive personal relationships is the best vehicle to introduce them to God and His Word.
- Believers need to be trained how to develop positive relationships to train more disciples to do the same.

In 2020 MCC embarked on a bold plan to tackle this challenge by bringing our higher education courses to non-traditional students in a unique format: delivering online programs focused on disciple making that stress immediate practical application of the knowledge learned.

Our 10-year vision is to see MCC graduates involved in disciple making movements around the world. **MCC's Meeting The Challenge Campaign** is designed to support this vision. The goal of \$333,000 per year for 5 years will:

- Deliver more online programs
- Provide more student bursaries
- Support more churches


