



# **Building Legacy**

n this edition of The Messenger you will find our Annual Enrollment and Financial Report for 2020/2021. Developing a simplified way of showing enrollment and the associated costs of running Maritime Christian College is always a balancing act. We want to show enough data to allow people to understand at a high level what is going on with our student enrollment and our finances. We also don't want to overwhelm people with reams of financial data that might cause them to miss the main points we want to highlight.

So before reading any further, I encourage you to turn to the section titled "Annual Enrollment and Financial Report" and have a look at it.

The first thing I want to draw your attention to in this Annual Report is the number of full-time, part-time, and auditing students took a huge jump in the last academic year. This is because of the new part-time online programs MCC built and offered for the first time in the fall of 2020. These are targeted towards followers of Jesus who are not in a position to leave their home town to attend MCC on a full-time basis. You can read some of the testimonials about these courses in this Messenger.

As we start the third decade of the 21st century, we feel we are on the right track to align our courses to help churches focus on fulfilling the Great Commission to "go and make disciples". MCC's role in supporting the Great Commission was articulated in its founding Bylaws, which state the school would "endeavour to so educate and inspire its students as to make them effective servants of Christ". Our founding documents also state that MCC shall "make the Bible its chief textbook, arrange all its courses of study, and conduct its work in harmony with the spirit and the letter of the Word of God". We feel blessed that the Lord is allowing MCC's work to continue as we are evolving the methods of how we educate our students, but not altering the message of the Gospel nor the Bible as our foundation.

For those of you who looked further into the financial summary for last year, the main point I want to highlight is that it takes a lot of generous donations from individuals and churches to operate our school. In this Messenger I am please to announce that we are introducing a new way for people to donate to MCC, through our Legacy Fund. For supporters who are able to contribute from their financial assets instead of from their monthly cash flow, the Legacy Fund is an exciting way to take part in something that has eternal value: helping people around the world discover what it means to become a disciple of Jesus.



"I've talked with leaders over the years and hear the comment, 'I've never been discipled, I don't know how to make a disciple,'" said Brandon Guindon, Course Developer of P111 Introduction to Healthy Leadership. "These courses...help you be the healthiest leader you can be and be a great disciple maker because when we look at it, disciple making is about a lifestyle, who you are, not just what you do."

Halifax Christian Church's leadership participated in the course along with other leaders in the Maritimes and US.



Full-time, Part-time, and Auditing Students combined




#### Academic Program Highlights from 2020-2021

- Dr. Jerry Scripture was hired as the Director of Online Learning
- Tim Cook began working with MCC in student recruitment, church relations, and advancement
- Two new online asynchronous certificates were launched in September 2020: the Disciple Maker Certificate and the CoVocational Certificate
- One new online asynchronous certificate was launched in May 2021: the Disciple Making Church Leadership Certificate
- Forty-nine students from Canada (AB-3, NB-7, NS-16, ON-7, PE-11), the USA (AK-1, OH-1, TX-2) and Nigeria (1) took classes via on campus/Zoom or online asynchronous classes
- A digital re-platforming was completed consisting
  of four main areas: a re-vamped website including
  new branding; our Learning Management System set
  up for online applications via our website; our office
  software systems and data moved to the Microsoft
  365 cloud-based platform; and a significant upgrade
  to the Wi-Fi network on campus to better serve our
  residents
- A partnering agreement with RENEW.org was developed that allowed MCC to access resources within their network to support the disciple making curriculum
- A partnership with Brandon Guindon, lead pastor of Real Life Ministries Texas, was established to develop courses for two new certificates
- A contract with RightNow Media was signed allowing MCC to offer access to alumni, students, staff & supporters

#### **Fiscal Highlights**


- An increase in enrollment due to online courses balanced out the decrease of full-time student tuition
- MCC qualified for Covid-19 funding through the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy and Canada Emergency Business Account Loan
- The roof was replaced due to substantial leaking, after many years of patching
- The Director of Online Learning position was added to payroll

#### Investments



#### **Legacy Fund**

This new Fund is an opportunity for MCC donors to support the concept of "giving in perpetuity". When a person makes a donation to the Legacy Fund, their donation and the interest generated will be used to fund strategic new initiatives at MCC such as:

- Developing new Certificate Programs with courses that can be taken online from anywhere, anytime. The cost to develop a five-course Certificate and deliver it the first time is \$50,000.
- Increasing the number of bursaries for new students who may require financial support. The College would like to increase the amount of bursary funds available every year by \$50,000.
- Ongoing physical improvements to the MCC campus at 503 University Avenue in Charlottetown. We anticipate these improvements will average \$20,000 per year into the foreseeable future.
- Re-starting the annual K.T. Norris Lectures and two Leadership Advances per year. These events cost \$15,000 per year to develop and stage.
- Supporting new Christian ministries across Canada. MCC believes one of the outcomes of its focus on disciple making will be that a new generation of believers will capture the passion to "make disciples who make disciples" by launching new ministries in the Maritimes and across Canada.

The Legacy Fund provides an opportunity for donors to contribute from their asset base. These donations can be cash, marketable securities, or other assets that can often be designated as part of an estate plan.

For potential donors who may be considering a gift to the Legacy Fund, and who don't have a licensed investment advisor, an accountant, and a lawyer, MCC can recommend some qualified professionals to contact.





# **Backyard Beautification - Phase 2**

ast year we received enough money to complete Phase 1 of the Backyard Beautification Project. The backyard is looking great and being used regularly now. There are three more areas in immediate need of repair. The



retaining wall along the driveway to the backyard is cracked and crumbling, the drainage hole in the parking lot is sinking and the privacy fence on both sides of the building is rotten. We would like to fix these areas in 2021 for both looks and safety.

In addition we had some vandalism in the backyard in May. There was some expense to cleaning the spray paint off and we will have to look into addition lighting and security cameras. Fixing the fence on both sides of the building will help secure the perimeter of the backyard.


